20th Annual Huntsman Cup Results

The 20th Annual Huntsman Cup ski races ended Thursday after three days of great competition. Racers from around the world came to Park City Mountain Resort and put on a great show for all the spectators.

The Huntsman Cup is an international race and a points qualifier for the World Cup and the U.S. National Disabled Championships.

New Zealand's **Adam Hall** (stand-up) took the men's overall title. Hall won Tuesday's Giant Slalom as the only racer with two runs under one minute. Hall finished 3.5 seconds faster than Park City's Monte Meier to win Wednesday's Slalom race, as well. In Thursday's race, Hall earned his third victory in three days.

The women's overall title was won by Canadian **Chantal Fowler** (sit-ski). Fowler finished in second place each of the first two days, but her first place finish on Thursday gave her the points necessary to win the title.

For two decades, the Huntsman Cup has been one of the Center's greatest athletic sporting events. This year, international participants came from Australia, Canada, and New Zealand, Great Britain and Japan.

The National Ability Center is a non-profit organization that provides recreational and therapeutic sports for people of all abilities. The Center is the largest adaptive sports or recreation organization in the country. Alpine skiing was the first program to be offered at the National Ability Center. Last year more than 5,000 lessons were taught on the greatest snow on earth. The program has provided our participants not only the chance to learn how to ski but has also produced several first class athletes and paralympians.
